Pirelli is one of the world's leading tyre manufacturers for both the road and the race circuit. With over 150 years of history, the Italian firm has a celebrated past of performance and innovation.

Innovative technology often finds its home on the racing circuit, and this has been the case for Pirelli throughout the company's existence. As an example, radial tyres were in their infancy during the 1970s, and were characterised by a narrow build and thus a smaller contact patch with the road. If you wanted a wider tyre for improved traction, the only option was cross-ply construction. The factory Lancia rally team wanted to use radial tyres, but required a wider contact patch to get the car's power down to the ground efficiently. This resulted in a collaboration

with Pirelli for the 1975 season, in which Lancia secured the World Rally Championship.

The P-Zero family of tyres is in exclusive use within GT Winter Series, GT4 Winter Series, Formula Winter Series and the 6h of Portimão. The collaboration with Pirelli allows GEDLICH Racing's events to offer the same tyres that teams compete with in a majority of the world's premiere GT and F4 competitions.

Beyond our paddock, Pirelli rubber is the exclusive supplier of tyres for Formula 1, Formula 2 and Formula 3, the global portfolio of GT World Challenge events, plus the World Superbike Championship.

Compliance with the "Balance of Performance" will be strictly monitored by technical commissioners and external service providers. For the GT cars, the BoPs will be provided by our licensing partner SRO.

THROWBACK 2025

Check out the past GTWS Season





The 2025 GT Winter Series season began at the famed Circuito Estoril, and for the second year in a row, it was GT3 Poland that immediately came to the fore. Seweryn Mazur piloted the Cup 4, Super Trofeospec Lamborghini to overall victory, which set the tone for a weekend that defied expectations.

In wet conditions, Cristiano Maciel rose to the occasion in his Cup 1-entered Ferrari 296 Challenge. From seventh on the grid, the Portuguese racer won his second-ever motor race in commanding fashion. The sweep of Cup class cars taking overall victories at Estoril was completed by Andreas Bogh Sorensen in the pitstop race, at the wheel of his Ferrari 296 Challenge.

Another GT racing debutant turned heads at the second round in Portimão. Keanu Al Azhari made his first appearance in GT3 machinery, in an SSR Performance Porsche 992 GT3 R. The talented driver from the Middle East won both of the 30-minute sprint races, but would unfortunately miss the pitstop race. In the soggy final encounter of the weekend, John Dhillon and Matt Griffin secured the race victory, leading a 1-2-3 of AF Corse Cup 1 entries.

A deluxe 38-car grid joined the GT Winter Series for the third round of the season in Valencia.

In the first race, Schubert Motorsport's Sandro and Juliano Holzem won overall, in the Invitational class BMW M4 GT3 Evo.



In a weekend featuring some of the most successful teams in GT racing, victories would be hard-fought on Sunday. A collision at the first corner brought out a Safety Car on the first lap of the weekend's second race. Upon the resumption of racing, Luca Engstler led the way in his family team's Lamborghini. The German crossed the line as the race winner, in his return from racing after injuries sustained at Macau in November.

Engstler, along with teammate Jonas Karklys, also secured victory in the third race of the weekend. Meanwhile, AF Corse's Cristiano Maciel and Rui Aguas left Valencia with a 20-point overall points advantage headed to the next round at Motorland Aragon.

The first race of the Aragon weekend marked the first overall victory of the season for SR Motorsport's Moritz Wiskirchen. Meanwhile, the second race was won by Simon Birch of Razoon – more than racing. It was a dominant display from the young Dane. The final race of the weekend was held in mixed conditions, and while many teams switched to wet tyres, Marcus Clutton remained on slicks. Remarkably, Clutton's pace never faltered, and he secured victory for himself, Simon Orange, and Orange Racing by JMH.

With over 25 cars present, the season finale at the Circuit de Barcelona-Catalunya was another high-point of the 2025 GT Winter Series. The first race of the weekend was controlled by Comtoyou Racing's Kobe Pauwels, who secured the team's first GT Winter Series victory. The second race was another showcase for Simon Birch of Razoon – more than racing, who held off Luca Engstler for the race victory. This continued into the final race of the season, which Birch and teammate Leo Pichler won by a stunning 22 seconds.

With fourth and second-place finishes on Sunday in Barcelona, Maciel and Aguas did enough to comfortably win the overall title. A spin at the start of race three for Kenneth Heyer helped make the path to the title easier for the AF Corse pair, but Heyer and Wiskirchen's SR Motorsport still came second in the standings, winning the GT3 championship. The 2025 GT Winter Series was the most exciting to date, with the highest average grid numbers since GT4 cars were split into their own category.

The third season of the SRO-licenced GT4 Winter Series will once again be a show-stealer on the GEDLICH Racing Winter Series package

The high-level of GT4 racing across the continent is evident in the summer, and in the Winter Series, the best teams from across Europe converge on one grid.

For season three, the GT4 Winter Series will be held across five events at the Iberian region's finest racing facilities. Each event's competitive running is split across two 30-minute sprints and a 60-minute pitstop race.

Driver categorisation determines the class you are entered into; AM for all-Bronze line-ups, PRO-AM for line-ups featuring one bronze driver alongside a driver graded silver or above, and PRO for all-silver or silver/gold driver combinations. Points are scored within your class, as well as in an overall championship classification.

THROWBACK 2025

Check out the past GT4WS Season





The second season of the GT4WS once again offered hugely competitive battles and excitement galore. Elite Motorsport and their driver McKenzy Cresswell secured the 2025 GT4WS teams' and drivers' championships, against an impressive field emanating from across Europe.

Elite started its season on a high, with three race victories at the Circuito Estoril in its McLaren Artura GT4. Cresswell, along with Josh Rattican, swept the weekend in dominant fashion. Flashes of pace were evident from the likes of the SR Motorsport Mercedes of Enrico Förderer and Jay Mo Hartling, and the RAFA Racing McLaren of Charlie Hart and Callum Davies. However, Elite marked itself as the team to beat early on.

Next time out in Portimão, McKenzy Cresswell started off the weekend with yet another victory for Elite Motorsport. In second position, the FK Performance BMW of Benjamin Sylvestersson made an impression in its first appearance of the year. The RAFA McLaren of Callum Davies was second on the road, but was dropped to third for track limits penalties.

Sunday morning's second race marked the first race victory of the season for SR Motorsport, as Jay Mo Hartling delivered a magnificent drive. The final race of the weekend saw a stellar performance for the AM class entry of Joachim Bölting, at times outpacing all of the PRO cars and even leading the race in greasy conditions. He would ultimately finish fourth on the road, but was demoted to seventh after accruing 35 seconds of penalties for track limits.



RAFA Racing's Callum Davies and Charlie Hart won the 60-minute endurance race, ahead of Elite Motorsport's Cresswell and Rattican.

The Valencia weekend marked the finest hour of the 2025 season for Förderer and Hartling. The German duo won all three races, bringing them much closer to the championship lead. The same could not be said for RAFA Racing, whose McLaren was set to start from pole in race one. However, a gear selection on the sighting lap resulted in a non-start for the British team.

SR Motorsport's Motorland Aragon weekend also started well, with yet another race victory courtesy of Förderer. Sunday morning's race two was held in wet conditions, in which W&S Motorsport's Alon Gabbay excelled. A late safety car was triggered by a spin for his W&S teammate Daniel Blickle, but this did not affect Gabbay, who still won the race ahead of Elite's Tom Lebbon, who took over co-driving duties from Joshua Rattican from Valencia onwards.

Race three was a victory for Elite's Cresswell and Lebbon. It was another commanding performance from the McLaren pairing, who won the race by 15 seconds.

At the Circuit de Barcelona-Catalunya, the largest-ever field in the short history of the GT4 Winter Series was assembled, with 27 cars taking the start. Race one of the weekend marked a McLaren 1-2. On the road, this was led by the Elite McLaren of Tom Lebbon. However, track limit abuse led to a five-second penalty, and the win was therefore handed to Charlie Hart of RAFA Racing. Lebbon was still classified in second place.

Race two marked a victory for Razoon – more than racing's Denny Berndt. Meanwhile, with a fourth-place finish, McKenzy Cresswell sewed up the titles for he and Elite Motorsport. The final race of the season offered one last drama, as RAFA Racing by Race Lab were stripped of victory courtesy of leaving the pitlane with a red light on, shortly after the Safety Car came out. This allowed Cresswell and Tom Lebbon to inherit the win, and end the season on the top step of the podium.





TEAM + DRIVER CLASSIFICATION 2025

A sensational second GT4WS season!

The GT4 Winter Series proved to be a resounding success once more, with strong grids, close competition and great battles throughout the class standings.

The 2025 grid was enhanced by the Club class, allowing older GT4 machinery with expired homologations onto the grid, alongside the current-generation of cars in the PRO, PRO-AM and AM classes. As was the case in the first season, there was a class for the 'CS'-spec Porsche Caymans, which produced some of the closest runs to the chequered flag across all classifications.

The 2026 GT4 Winter Series is likely to be yet another step forward for this popular grid, with even more multi-national interest and more marques set to be represented. British teams, drivers and manufacturers have secured both overall championships to this point; will the championship be won by a new nation in 2026?

We look forward to welcoming new teams and returning faces for what should be a thrilling third season of the SRO-licenced GT4 Winter Series!

Top teams, variety and close competition – a thrilling first edition of the GEDLICH Racing 6h of Portimão

At the first edition of the GEDLICH Racing 6h of Portimão, Razoon – more than racing were victorious in the Porsche 992 GT3 R. The driver pairing of Simon Birch and Thomas Andersen lifted the trophy, but endured intense competition throughout the race.

The first-ever six-hour race organised by GEDLICH featured a 35-minute minimum combined pitstop time in the first five hours and 30 minutes, across at least five pitstops. Teams took unique approaches to serving the minimum time, and the race proved to be strategically compelling throughout.

As the race began at 11:30am local time, the pole-sitting Razoon Porsche held the early lead with Thomas Andersen at the wheel. However, just minutes into the race, Greystone GT's Oliver Webb arrived in the Porsche's wing mirrors, and quickly found a way by. Webb proceeded to fortify an early lead in the McLaren 7205 GT3 Evo. Meanwhile, Andersen was being hounded by the Landgraf Mercedes of Jörg Viebahn, the similar car driven by AKM Motorsport's Marco Antonelli, and the Cup 2-leading A-Workx Porsche 992 GT3 Cup driven by Nico Menzel.

As the race approached the conclusion of the first half-hour, Antonelli started to move forward rapidly. The AKM team boss dispatched both Viebahn and Andersen, only to pit two laps later. The Mercedes idled past its garage and into the refuelling area at the end of the pits, marking the first of what would prove to be several shorter, more frequent pitstops.

For the first two hours, AKM's Mercedes would pit approximately every 30 minutes, while most other teams would pit closer to the end of each hour. Oliver Webb was one of the last to make his first pitstop, handing over to Andrey Borodin with just over an hour and ten minutes in the books.

With Borodin at the wheel, the Greystone GT team's advantage would soon be eroded by Simon Birch, who had taken over the Razoon Porsche, and quickly became the race leader. Soon, the McLaren would be demoted to third, after a spin for Borodin. Tom Kalendar had taken over the Landgraf Mercedes, and charged by Borodin shortly after the spin.

With that, the story of the race lead was established. Over the next several hours, Landgraf's pairing would match Birch and Andersen, but the gap remained at roughly a minute throughout the race. This distance was established in the second hour, after Viebahn remained in the car for longer than Andersen, and Birch took full advantage in the Razoon Porsche.

Andersen and Birch would ultimately win by one minute and 23 seconds, after the Landgraf Mercedes received 20 seconds worth of track limits penalties. Viebahn and Kalendar finished second, while the AKM Motorsport entry rounded out the overall podium. Antonelli, along with Raffaele Giammaria and Aaron Farhadi, drove a trouble-free race, and were able to beat the Greystone GT McLaren to the podium thanks to greater consistency.

In the Cup 2 class for Porsche 992 Cup cars, the A-Workx team controlled much of the race, courtesy of particularly rapid stints from Nico Menzel, and faultless running from Rodriguez Menzl. The Mtech Competition team from Sweden put in a good effort, with particular heroics from Gustav Soderberg Krogh during his stints.

A-Workx ultimately won the class, taking fifth overall and finishing a lap clear of the Mtech car. Steiner Racing rounded out the Cup 2 podium.

Lionspeed GP were victorious in the GT4 category, despite a race that started with a brief visit to the pits. The line-up of Damian Freda, Steven Berndtson and Patrick Kolb were only 35 seconds clear of the NM Racing Team Mercedes at the end of the race, but this was extended by 20 seconds after late track limits penalties accrued by NM's Ian loggie. The Spanish team had the strongest pace in the GT4 class, but a slew of bad luck befell the AMG GT4. This included a shock absorber failure in the first hour and a puncture in hour four.

Monteiros Competições finished tenth overall, and won the TCX class. Henrique Oliveira started the F82-spec BMW M4 GT4, and led all of the newer GT4 machines in the overall standings during the first hour.

Check out the past FWS Season



An improved recipe delivers the best season yet

The 2025 Formula Winter Series saw the series come of age, and deliver some of the best races in series history.

Pirelli tyres were re-introduced to the series after a year on Hankook rubber, and TM Performance became the brake-disc supplier. This move brought the series closer to the specifications of the Italian, CEZ and British F4 series, and thus came a shift in the competitors for the new season.

The first race of the season in Portimão set the tone for the championship fight. Gabriel Gomez of US Racing was beaten off the line by Hitech TGR's Leo Robinson, who proceeded to lead much of the race, until a late safety car intervened. The race resumed with just one lap to go, and Robinson's tyres were no longer offering the grip he needed. Gomez managed to usurp the Hitech driver for the first win of 2025.

Gomez would double-up in the second race of the weekend, leading home an US Racing 1-2 ahead of Edu Robinson. A hugely dramatic third race of the weekend was held in greasy conditions. Fionn McLaughlin, Hitech TGR's young Irishman from the Red Bull Junior Team, set about dominating in the tricky conditions to wrap-up his first weekend of car racing.

For Gabriel Gomez, the momentum didn't stop there. At the Circuit Ricardo Tormo, he won the first race ahead of Leo Robinson and Maxim Rehm. His streak of podiums continued in the second race, finishing third, behind race winner Rehm, and Robinson. Leo Robinson finally secured his first win of the season in the third race at Valencia.

The first race of the Motorland Aragon weekend saw a new winner emerge, as US Racing's Kabir Anurag claimed his first FWS victory. Meanwhile, the second race began a dominant Sunday for Fionn McLaughlin, as he secured another wet weather win ahead of Anurag following a late-race safety car.



The third race proved to be something unlike any Formula Winter Series race before it. The circuit had all but dried out as the cars arrived to the grid, and only one driver – Renauer Motorsport's Simon Schranz – had wet tyres on his car. The rest of the field was on slicks, and as the formation lap began, the rain started to fall.

Schranz started from 20th on the grid, but such was his advantage that he crossed the line at the end of lap two as the race leader. Alas, a half-spin at the first corner demoted him behind Jenzer's Bart Harrison, who had stormed up from a pitlane start due to a wet tyre switch. The pitlane was rife with tyre changes early on. However, as the race passed half-distance, the circuit started drying, and slick-shod runners began to rediscover their pace. And, in these tricky conditions, it was Fionn McLaughlin who came to the fore, winning by six seconds after staying on slicks for the entire race.

The final weekend of the season at Barcelona

Going into the final weekend of the season at Barcelona, Gabriel Gomez had yet to finish off the podium. However, as the first race of the weekend began, the Brazilian failed to get off the line. Thankfully, all parties avoided the US Racing car, which never started the race. Leo Robinson and Fionn McLaughlin - the two drivers still in mathematical championship contention - finished one-two in the race, with Robinson securing the victory.

On Sunday morning in race two, the pair of Hitech drivers again swept the race standings. However, Gomez only needed to score four points to secure the title. He finished fifth, which was enough to secure Formula Winter Series championship glory with a race to spare.

The third and final race was a complex affair. A lightning-fast start from second row starter Thomas Bearman (Hitech) granted him an early lead. However, this was soon revealed to have been a jump start, and a five-second time penalty was applied to his race result. The young British driver's lead ran as high as 3.5 seconds, but he was unable to negate the penalty. Running in second at the line, Bart Harrison celebrated his presumed win, but a last-minute track limits penalty hit just after the chequered flag. This promoted the driver that crossed the line third - Kabir Anurag - to the final top step of the season.

A dominant champion on an impressive grid

The 2025 Formula Winter Series season was the most eye-catching in the short history of the championship. A winning formula is now in place to foster some of the most competitive entry lists of any category at this level.

Congratulations to the champions – Gabriel Gomez and US Racing. A nod must also go the dominant force of the Female Trophy class, Hitech's Nina Gademan, who took seven victories in the class. Red Bull's young Irish hope – Fionn McLaughlin – comfortably won the rookie standings in his first car racing campaign.

The 2026 Formula Winter Series will see an expanded calendar, and a new crop of exciting young talents fighting for the championship – who's next on the top step?

Soufi becomes a two-time champion; season two of the Prototype Winter Series goes to Konrad Motorsport

The 2025 Prototype Winter Series once again showcased the second-generation of LMP3 machinery, bringing the thunder of the 5.6-litre Nissan VK56 V8 to Spain and Portugal, quite possibly for the final time.

The second season of the Prototype Winter Series was a story of dominance, as Danny Soufi and Konrad Motorsport won seven races of the eight held across four weekends.

The season began at the Circuito Estoril. A battle that had been seen numerous times during 2024, between Soufi and the DKR Engineering Duqueine of Jon Brownson and Laurents Hörr, once again took place in the first race. In the first stint, Soufi dominated. Even though his pitstop would have to be 30 seconds longer than DKR's pairing, owing to the pitstop handicap system based on driver rating, Soufi still went into the second half of the race in the lead. After the pitstops, Hörr shrunk the gap, but Soufi and Konrad Motorsport still won the race by ten seconds.

Race two was a more dominant affair for Soufi, winning the race by over 100 seconds, ahead of Quentin Joseph and David Droux in the CLX Motorsport Ligier.

At the following round in Portimão, Soufi once again swept the weekend. Soufi had a controlled drive in the first race, while a three-way battle for third between DKR's Jon Brownson, CLX's Quentin Joseph and Racing Spirit of Leman's Christian Gisy turned heads. Unfortunately, Gisy and Joseph made contact at turn three. This allowed Brownson to hold a comfortable third place until the pit window, and his teammate Hörr converted this into a second-place finish, ahead of the CLX Ligier.



The second race once again saw Soufi secure a relatively straight-forward victory. CLX's pairing finished second, meaning a 100 per cent record of podiums across the four races in Portugal, establishing them in second position in the championship behind Soufi.

After a break in February, the series resumed at Motorland Aragon.

Konrad Motorsport's Danny Soufi once again performed flawlessly in the first race of the weekend, once again finishing ahead of Droux and Joseph in the CLX Ligier. Racing Experience's Matthias Bjerre Jakobsen had an impressive last stint of the race, holding off Laurents Hörr of DKR Engineering to secure the first podium of the season for the #12 Duqueine.

Hörr's teammate Jon Brownson woke up ill on Sunday morning, and thus, the German drove the second race solo. And, while Hörr started the race from third, he quickly moved up to the lead in slippery conditions. The DKR driver won the race by a dozen seconds over Soufi, marking the first non-Konrad Motorsport win of the season.

The season finale at Barcelona featured the largest grid of the season, with new entries from KC2 Racing and Team Virage, alongside a second entry from Konrad Motorsport for Zino-Ferret Fahlke.

Danny Soufi left Aragon on the verge of winning the championship. And so, with yet another dominant, race-winning performance from Soufi at the first race in Barcelona, the championships were decided. Soufi won the Prototype Winter Series drivers' title for the second consecutive time, while Konrad wrapped up the teams' title.

On the Sunday, Konrad Motorsport made one last statement. Soufi and Fahlke drove home to a 1-2 finish for the Konrad team, ahead of High Class Racing's Philip Lindberg. Meanwhile, finishing in fourth, CLX Motorsport's Quentin Joseph and David Droux finished in fourth. This was enough to wrap up second in the standings ahead of Laurents Hörr, whose points score had been separated from Jon Brownson owing to his solo victory at Aragon.

The Soufi/Konrad double-down – an incredible achievement

The performance of Soufi and Konrad Motorsport was even more impressive than the team-driver combination's 2024 championship victory. With seven victories and an impressive dominant streak, Soufi and Konrad headed into their summer programme with great momentum and yet another accolade for the history-making team.

The 2026 Prototype Winter Series will mark an interesting opportunity for bigger grids and new teams, as the third-generation of LMP3 cars expands the ACO's 'junior' prototype concept to more competitors than ever.


